THE DIRECTORS have pleasure in submitting their report for the year ending Dec. 31st, 1902, with the financial statement duly audited.

INCOME.—The net premium income was \$1,111,897.41; Interest and Rents, \$275,507.05; Annuities, \$1,056; Profit and Loss, \$2,637.81; total income, \$1,391,098.23.

ASSETS.—The cash assets now amount to \$6,098,333.54, and the total assets are \$6,459,750.08, an increase for the year of \$701,957.31.

LIABILITIES.—The total liabilities are \$5,000,629.84, including the reserve for the security of policy holders \$5,925,443.97, computed on the Company's standard 4 per cent and 3 1/2 per cent.
