New York, Oct. 14.—Dr. Russell O. Stebbins, chairman of the executive committee of the Arctic Club of America, said he had been led to expect that Mr. Peary would make a much stronger statement than the one officially issued.

"Commander Peary," said he, "could have followed a much simpler course in this whole matter, and I am somewhat surprised that he did not do so. He should have at first presented his own proofs of his achievement and then waited for Dr. Cook to forward his. I believe both men reached the Pole, but a matter of proof more than the testimony of Eskimos will be required to show who did and who did not accomplish such a feat. It is absurd to suppose that Eskimos who have no acquaintance with maps, and know nothing of longitude and latitude should be expected to indicate where they had been with any degree of accuracy.

Ottawa Hears of Big Project-No Absolute Arrangements With Government Arrived

Ottawa, Oct. 14.—It is announced on unquestionable authority that Harland and Wolff, the big shipbuilders of Belfast, will construct two ship-yards and dry docks in Canada, one at Levis, Que., and the other at St. John, N. B., capable of constructing and repairing warships of the largest British type. The firm will invest british type. Levis is preferred to Montreal as being nearest tidewater, and yet well above the fortifications which in time of war will close the St. Lawrence, and St. John is chosen as being the Emily Melissa Pierce late of the City terminus of the Transcontinental Railway lines. The firm will carry to make payment to the undersigned on a general shipbuilding business and will tender for the proposed warships.

Under the legislation of 1908 Harvaland and Wolff will be entitled to an aggregate annual subsidy of \$90,000 for twenty years, assuming that each dry dock will cost not less than \$1,500,000. It is stated, however, that the Government is prepared to give them further financial encouragement and legislation may be looked for at the next session providing subsidies for shipbuilding in Canada. There is already a Government dry dock at Levis, sixty feet wide and 600 feet long, but it is not large enough to accommodate the large steamers of the C. P. R. and of the White Star Dominion line. It is reported that the C. P. R. and other Canadian interests are associated with the Belfast firm, and in this connection it is significant that the C. P. R. has already secured a desirable site for a dry dock at Levis. Under the federal act the dry docks must be built at places to be approved by the Governorin-Council, and it is said that the locations at Levis and St. John have been approved by the Government. The pending application to Parliament for a charter by the Dominion Dry Dock and controlled by the Harland and Wolff Company.
