Objects to change in the liquor law

To Editor of The Standard:

Sir,—In reading over the bills submitted to the provincial government by the New Brunswick Temperance Federation, also the Moral and Social Reform Council, I find them both faulty. In the first I find a weakness on the part of those presenting the bill by saying in case this bill is not passed, that is the prohibitory bill. The Moral and Social Reform Council asked for drastic amendments to the present legislation.

The first amendment to the present law, the closing of all bars at 7 o'clock, except on Saturday evening, which is to remain at 8. Now I contend if the licensed bars are closed at 7 o'clock every night in the week the kitchen bars run on the quiet will reap the benefit of the licensed man's expense. There will be more drunkenness in St. John with such a law than there is at the present time, and a great deal more wickedness also, and a man found drunk at midnight and arrested and brought before the court next day and questioned as to where he got his liquor, he can say at the licensed bar before closing time the evening before—and who can prove it different.

Now, if we had prohibition, a man could not make a story like the above and if he did not tell where he got the stuff to make him drunk, he can be kept in jail till he will have to tell the truth about the matter.

Now under such existing circumstances, as will be in case No. 1 amendment is passed, it will be better to leave the law as at present, and not let the meanest men reap the benefit from those who pay a license to sell liquor. And there will also be some of iniquity in all parts of the city along with the kitchen bars run on the sly to destroy the young of our land, and make the city ten times worse than at present.

In talking to those who drink, they tell me if an inspector of liquor were appointed to see if what is sold is not something to set a man crazy, it would be the best thing the temperance people could do.

Now this is only the opinion of one person; let us hear from others, but let us be careful and not make a law that will be worse than at present.

THE COURTS

County Court.

In the County Court Chambers yesterday, before Judge Forbes, the action of the Canadian Fairbanks Co., Ltd., against David and Stephen Moore for the sale of a pump and heater for their engine and boiler at Newcastle, was heard. Messrs. Moore dispute any liability in regard to the contract on the grounds that the goods were not delivered within the time agreed upon, and that the goods, as delivered, were not the goods ordered, that is, that the heater was not a complete heater for use in their mills. J. D. P. Lewis and Wm. Wallace K. C. appear for plaintiffs, and E. P. Raymond for defendants.
