TO INTERN ALIENS

London, July 8.—The parliamentary
committee recently appointed to con-
sider the alien question has issued a
report recommending the immediate
internment of every male enemy alien
over eighteen years, with the excep-
tion of those who, for medical or other
reasons, should be exempted, and the
repatriation of all female enemy
aliens, with the exception of those
whose husbands have been granted
exemption from internment.

U. S. SENATE BLOCKS PLAN TO TAKE OVER THE WIRE SYSTEMS

Total of 242 Union Operators
on Strike in United States
—C. P. Situation.

Washington, July 8.—The Senate
interstate commerce committee late
today decided to report immediately
without holding hearings, the House
resolution authorizing the president
to take over telegraph, telephone,
cable and radio systems during the
war.

Within a few minutes after the
committee's decision, Chairman
Smith formally presented the
committee's report to the Senate,
submitting the resolution without
change or recommendation.
After a spirited debate on the com-
mittee's action, the Senate on a
point of order by Senator Penrose
of Pennsylvania, rejected the report
and the resolution was returned to
the committee.

Union Men Strike.
Chicago, July 8.—Reports received
by S. J. Koenigkamp president of the
commercial telegraphers' union to-
day indicated that lockouts and
strikes resulted in the absence of
approximately 242 men from their
keys. His reports were not complete.

C. P. R. Disputes.
Ottawa, July 8.—The minister of
labor has established a board of con-
ciliation to deal with the dispute be-
tween the Canadian Pacific Company
and its commercial telegraphers.
