Still Quarantined.
The government steamer Lady
Laurier, which was quarantined when
she landed this port from Halifax,
is still under the medical ban.

Wandering Buoy.
A "wandering buoy" was taken to
Halifax from the West Indies this
week by the Royal Mail steamer
Chaudiere. This buoy had been wan-
dering all over the western ocean for
a year or more and finally brought
up at Antigua. It broke away from
its moorings on the Nova Scotia coast
and drifted out to sea, was caught by
the Arctic current and carried into
the Gulf Stream, which took it across
to the vicinity of the Azores, thence
along the coast of Africa and finally
back again and down to the Caribbean
Sea. Had not this buoy run foul of
the island of Antigua, it would be
still on its merry rounds, going over
the ground traversed by the Gulf
Stream. This is not a new or novel
occurrence, for several buoys from
the Nova Scotia buoy were in great
danger in West India waters from
mines which were drifting down into
the Southern Sea and this experience
of the Nova Scotia buoy would seem
to bear out the statement.

Yarmouth Boston Route.
The steamer North Land will take
up the freight and passenger service
between Yarmouth and Boston on
Tuesday next and the government
steamer Aramoer will go back to Hal-
fax for a general overhauling, joining
the fleet of ships at the Marine
Pier, Dartmouth, which now consists
of the Stanley, Laurentian, Lans-
downe and Eighteen No. 18, all of
which are laid up or undergoing re-
pairs. "The Bayfield, another of this
fleet, is laid up at a city wharf in Hal-
fax.

Shipping Complaint.
The British ministry of shipping is
certain of the lack of wharfage at
New York. Captain Howard, marine
superintendent, scheduled to take on
cargo there, had been diverted to
other ports, owing to lack of accom-
modation. Two hundred dollars a day
have been paid for the privilege of
loading a ship at one of the piers and
withdrawing the deck, the vessel be-
ing loaded from barges. An enormous
amount of damage has been done
through collision in the harbor in the
last two years, owing to vessels hav-
ing to anchor to await their turn for
a dock berth. This is a strong indi-
cation to hand out to the port for which
Halifax was abandoned by the Olympic
and other big ships.
