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by the General Conference ; as also in the Report of their Committee, relative to our affairs, which, accompanied by our Address to them, we have ordered also to be enclosed.

In conclusion, brethren, we would exhort you to aim in all your actions at the general good, and guard most effectually against that which has been indulged at the expense of thousands—party spirit. Cultivate a spirit of meekness and forbearance, keep the unity of the spirit, and live in the bonds of peace ; remember the time is short, the Lord is at hand, whatever therefore we have to do for God and his Church, must be done without delay.—And now dearly beloved, pray for us that we may be preserved blameless.—We commend you to God and the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance with all the sanctified that is incorruptible and that fadeth not away.
