any of them, accoiding to the above Rates, 'fhall be deemed a legal Tender in Payment of all Debts and Contracts, that have, or thall be made within this Province, where there is no fpecial Agreement to the Contrary, drawn up in, Writing, or before fufficient Witneffes; and that in all Agreements, Prior to, or fince the Conqueft of this Province, which have been made in Livres, according to the Method of Computation heretofore in Ufe, the Livre fhall be eftimated equal to One Sbilling of the Currency.hereby eftablifhed, the Dollar to be equal to Six Livres, or Six Sbillings, and in the fame Proportion for every Coin herein fpecified.

And whereas a Practice has been introduced of cutting Dollars, and of paffing the Fragments as fmall Change at an arbitrary Value; and the fame being liable to great Fraud and Abufe, It is bereby furtber Ordained and Declared; That from the Date of the Publication hereof, No Parts of Dollars; or any other Coin, fo cut, or otherwife clipped, fhall be admitted to pafs current by Way of Change in any Part of this Province; and that all Perfons, uttering or pafling any fuch, upon Conviction thereof by the Oath of one credible Witnefs, before one or more Juftices of Peace, fhall, for the firft Offence, forfeit the Sum of Ten Sbillings, current Money of the Province, and Twenty for the Second, befides one Month's Imprifonment; the faid Fines, fo levied, to be applied to His Majefty's Ufe.

And, in Order to prevent the Importation of Copper in fuch Abundance, as to drain the Country of its Gold andSilver, It is bereby further Ordained and Declared, by the Autbority aforefaid, That from the Date of the Publication hereof, all Sols Marques, whether old or new, fhall pafs only as Fartbings, that is to fay, From the Date of the Publication hereof, until the Firft Day of Fanuary next, Forty-Eigbt Sols Marqués fhall be deemed equal to One Sbilling Halifax, and Thirty of faid Sols Marqués equal to One Sbilling York Currency, but that from and after the faid Firft Day of Fanuary next enfuing, FortyEight of the faid Sols Marques fhall be equal to One Sbilling of the Currency of this Province. Provided neverthelefs, That no Perfon fhall be obliged to receive of faid Sols Marques, or other Copper, at any One Payment, for above the Value of One Sbilling of the Curfency hereby, eftablifhed.
