Concluding remarks. them principles and considerations of wide application, not confined to maritime neutrality, nor to the acts and conduct of maritime nations alone. Great Britain is prepared to accept the award, whether favourable or unfavourable to her. She desires only that it shall be just. She claims only that it shall be founded on a true and equitable interpretation of the law of nations, and on principles which she herself and all other Powers may be satisfied, whether as neutral or as belligerent, to acknowledge and abide by in time to come.
