

John B. Bowman, who removed from that State to U.C., 1820. B. in Woolwich, Waterloo, Ont., 1832. Ed. at Rockwood Commercial Academy. Is Presdt. of the Mercantile Fire Insu. Co. Has been Township Clerk and Treasurer of Woolwich, and Local Superintendent of Schools. Sat in Can. Assembly from 1864 until the Union. Returned to the Commons by acclamation at g.e., 1867, at g.e., 1872, and again at g.e., 1874. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e., 1878 and 1882. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—*St. Jacob's, Ont.*

BOYLE, ARTHUR. (*Monck.*)

Of Irish parentage. B. in Thorold, Ont., March 1842. M., in Dunnville, Sept. 1868, Annie E. Cormick. Is a dry goods merchant. Was Reeve of Dunnville 1877, 1878 and 1879, and Warden of the Co. of Haldimand in 1878 and 1879. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Monck at the g.e. for Ont. Leg. Assem., 1886. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Conservative; favors legislation of a more stringent character in connection with the Temperance question.—*Dunnville, Ont.*

BRIEN, JAMES, M.D. (*South Essex.*)

Father and mother emigrated from Enniskillen, Irel., in 1846, and settled in Tp. of Howard, Co. of Elgin. B. there 4 Feb., 1848. Ed. in London, Ont., and at the Royal Coll. of Physicians and Surgeons, Kingston, Ont. M., 7 Sept., 1880, Addie, only dau. of Rev. C. Burdette. Was the first Reeve of the village of Essex Centre, and a mem. of the Co. Council of Essex for three years. Has taken an active part in the promotion of agricultural interests, and has been for many years a dir. of various agricultural societies in Essex. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Essex Centre, Ont.*

BROWN, ADAM. (*Hamilton.*)

Descended from the Browns of Milntown, Langholm, Dumfries-shire, Scot. B. in Edinburgh, Scot., 3 April, 1826. Ed. at Rev. Dr. Black's Sch. in Montreal. M., 1st, in Hamilton, in 1852, Maria, dau. of the late Capt. Evatt (she died); 2nd, in 1862, Mary, dau. of Thomas Harley Kough, solicitor, Shrewsbury, Eng. Is a member of the firm of Brown, Balfour and Co., wholesale merchants. Was Presdt. of the Hamilton Board of Trade for several years; Presdt. of the Dominion Board of Trade, and
