FERGUSON, CHARLES FREDERICK, M.D. (North Leeds and Gren-ville.)

Family from Drumgunnion, Leitrim, Irel. S. of Mr. Robert Ferguson, of the Tp. of Kitley, Leeds, Ont. B. there. Graduated as M.D. at Queen's Univ., Kingston, 1859. M. Miss Bell, of Oxford, Co. Grenville, sister of the late Robert Bell, Esq., C.E., who represented Russell in the Can. Assem. previous to Confederation. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1874. Unseated on petition 10 Nov. 1874; re-elected 16 Dec. same year; re-elected at g.e. 1878, and again at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—Kemptville, Ont.

FERGUSON, JOHN, M.D. (Welland.)

Descended from an Irish family of Scotch extraction. whose estates lay in Galloway and Ayrshire. In 1660, James Ferguson, a younger s. of the family, became possessed of large property in the Co. of Cavan, Irel., in which he settled. His s. Thomas, and grand s. Richard, entered the army, the latter taking part in the troubles of 1743, as an officer in the King's Black Horse, (now the 7th Dragoon Guards,) under the Duke of Cumberland. Grand-father, Henry Ferguson, held a Commission in the Cavan Militia, and took an active part in the Irish Rebellion of 1798. Came to Canada in 1824 and settled in London Township. S. of John Ferguson, Esq., J.P., Co. of Middlesex, Ont. B. there in 1839. Ed. at the Grammar School, London, Ont. M. at Galt, Ont., in 1869, the only dau. of William Robinson, Esq., Galt. Graduated M.D., at Victoria Coll., Toronto, 1864. Is Coroner for the Co. of Middlesex. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative, and approves of the policy of Sir J. A. Macdonald.—Niagara Falls, Ont.: Rideau Club.

FISHER, SYDNEY ARTHUR, B. A., J.P. (Brome.)

S. of Dr. Arthur Fisher of Montreal, whose grand-father came to Can. from Dunkeld, Scot. B. in Montreal, 12 June 1850. Ed. at the High School and McGill Coll. there, and afterward at Trinity Coll. Cambridge, Eng., where he graduated B.A. Unmarried. Is a farmer and a J.P. for the District of Bedford, P.Q. Was an unsuccessful candidate for present seat at election, held October 1880, after death of sitting mem. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal, and favors a Revenue Tariff as opposed to a Protective Policy.—Alva Farm, Knowlton, P.Q.; Rideau Club.
