That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying His Excellency to cause to be laid before this House copies of the correspondence which has taken place between the Government of the Province of Quebec and the Government of Canada, and between the Government of the Province of Ontario and the Government of Canada, since the 1st of May, 1870, on the subject of the arbitration between Ontario and Quebec, under the British North America Act, 1867, as well as the correspondence with the Arbitrators on the same subject, and all Orders in Council or other Documents relating thereto, from the 1st of May, 1870, to the present time.

After Dobate

Galt, Messieurs Street, Cartwright and Mills to assist Mr. Speaker in the direction of the Library of Parliament, so far as the interests of this House are concerned, and to act as Members of a Joint Committee of both Houses on the Library.

Ordered, That the Honorable Sir John A. Macdonald do carry the said Message to the Senate.
