 the boundary lines of the different Townships 14  
 of the Province, and further to regulate the  
 manner in which Lands are hereafter to be 16  
 surveyed, and the Act of the Legislature of  
 this Province, passed in the Session held in 18  
 the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's  
 Reign, and intituled, "An Act to grant autho- 20  
 rity to licensed Surveyors, in that part of this  
 Province called Upper Canada, to administer 22  
 an Oath in certain cases, and to protect them  
 while in the discharge of their duty in Sur- 24  
 veying Lands," shall be and the said Acts  
 are hereby repealed: Provided always, 26  
 that the Acts or provisions of laws repealed  
 by those hereby repealed, or by any of them, 28  
 shall not revive, but shall be and remain  
 repealed; and provided also, that all boun- 30  
 dary or division lines, legally established  
 and ascertained, under the authority of the 32  
 said Acts, or any of them, shall remain  
 good, and all other Acts and things legally 34  
 done and performed under the authority of  
 the Acts hereby repealed, or any of them, 36  
 and in conformity to the provisions thereof,  
 shall remain good and valid notwithstand- 38  
 ing such repeal; and all prosecutions and  
 all actions or suits, at law or in equity, 40  
 actually commenced before the passing of  
 this Act, under the provisions of the said 42  
 Acts or any of them, may be continued,
