

Members of the Deputation which went to England and I have now the honor to report to Your Excellency that I have not been able to discover any Title or any other Evidence whatever which can in any way support the claim of the Roguists or show that they ever had any right to this Seigneurie or to any part of it those lots granted which they now hold as tenants under the Seminary of Montreal —

It is certain that the Seigneurie of the Lake of the Two Mountains was granted to the Ecclesiastics of the Seminary of St. Sulpice not in trust but to their own use on the seventeenth of October One thousand seven hundred and seventeen by the then Governor and Intendant of Canada and that this Grant with an augmentation of three Leagues in Depth was confirmed on the part of His most Christian Majesty by letters Patent of the 1st March 1735 for both these grants are duly enregistered in the Books of the Sovereign Council of Quebec but of the Assertion of the Roguists that there was a prior Grant of this estate to the Seminary to be held in trust for them, I have not found nor have they produced or pointed out to
