Referring to the part of your letter of the 6th instant relative to the complaint made by the Chief of Garden River Band about trespass made on Reserve and your action thereon I have to inform you that the constable you sent to examine the cut should have given you full and accurate information, if such could be obtained, and he should have made a seizure of the timber if not removed.

The Department has no knowledge of McFadden & Milloy and you should demand payment from them based on double the rate of dues shown in the Tariff on page 173 of the Timber Regulations.

You should also report as to the right real or pretended, under which this Company claim to erect buildings on the Reserve.
