

To the best of my knowledge unit members did not have access to my room. It was not necessary for me coming to see me to first pass thru the civilians, they could ~~enter~~ just walk up the stairs to my room. I was friendly to the civilian occupants of the ~~house~~ <sup>house</sup>. Once in while I was treated to tea or coffee and occasionally a piece of bread and jam by the occupants of the house. I never received liquor or beer from the Sanders family. On the 14 Feb 45 I did not contact the City between the hrs of 1900 hrs & 2100 hrs. I think Yatsu will call at approx 2300 hrs.

The Court

There was approx 100 oz of rum in the jug when I left my bullets at 1900 hrs. My best estimate would be between 90 & 130 oz of rum in the jug at 1900 hrs. I was looking after all the rum issues, a jug of rum was good for 4 complete issues and I kept the jug in my room ~~between~~ between issues. I have never recovered the missing rum of a jug.
