

To do

To do good,	<i>faire du bien.</i>
To do work,	<i>faire de l'ouvrage.</i>
To do well,	<i>faire bien.</i>
To do an exercise,	<i>faire un devoir.</i>
To do a favour,	<i>faire une faveur.</i>
To do harm to,	<i>faire du mal à.</i>
To do damage to,	<i>faire tort à.</i>

N.B. 1o In the French expression *faire cuire, faire bouillir, faire rôtir, faire* is not translated.

Ex. : To cook,	<i>faire cuire.</i>
To boil,	<i>faire bouillir.</i>
To roast,	<i>faire rôtir.</i>

2o *To do* is used in the following cases.

To affirm with more force.

Ex. : I do work,
Je travaille certainement.

To replace another verb.

Ex. : He plays as well as you do.
Il joue aussi bien que vous.

With negative, interrogative, etc., verbs.

Do you play ? I do not play.
Jouez-vous ? Je ne joue pas.

3o *To do* is also used independently with the meaning of *to feel (se porter)*.

Ex. : How do you do ?
Comment vous portez-vous ?
