

twenty-one in the year, and any other stranger as visitor if resident more than thirty miles from Victoria, for any number of days not exceeding seven in the year. A register of the number of days for which a visitor is introduced shall be kept by the Secretary of the Club, and the introduced member shall be notified accordingly. He may also invite any non-member to luncheon or dinner, or both, on one day in each week, such day to be declared by the Committee and known as guest day, the guest to have the privilege of the use of the billiard, card and reading rooms. All expenses incurred by the guest to be defrayed by the introducer. Guests' names, with the introducers, to be inserted in a book to be kept for that purpose. Provided, however, that no person shall be entitled to any of the privileges hereinbefore set forth, if he shall have been at any time an unsuccessful candidate for election to membership.

GENERAL CONDUCT.

XXXV.

In case the conduct of any member either in or out of the Clubhouse shall, in the opinion of the Committee, be injurious to the character or interests of the Club, the Committee shall be empowered to recommend such member to resign; provided that no such recommendation shall be sent to any member unless the same shall have been agreed to by two-thirds of the members of the whole Committee, at a meeting of the Committee summoned for that purpose. And if such member does not resign within the space of one calendar month from the notification of such recommendation of the Committee, it shall be the duty of the Committee to suspend him. Provided also, that if the Committee present at such meeting are unanimously of opinion that the offence of such member is of so grave a character as in the interest of the Club to warrant his immediate expulsion, the Committee at such meeting are hereby empowered
