

Some idea of the unlimited possibilities of Northern Ontario may be gained from facts relative to the illustration herewith, which shows the school children at Cochrane, Ontario, as they turned out at the time of the recent visit of The Canadian Press Association. A year and a half ago, there was not a child in Cochrane. Note the character of the soil as shown in the foreground of the illustration. There are thousands and thousands of acres of similar soil in the Great Clay Belt, much of which is close to a railroad and can be purchased from the Government for 50 cents an acre.
