THOMAS GODWYN, founder and first pastor of an old Non-conformist Church, meeting in troublous times, 1640, in Anchor Lane, Thames Street, afterwards removing to Paved Alley, Lime St., thence 1755 to Miles Lane, thence 1766 to Canonile St., in 1810 to the memorable Poultry Chapel, close to the Bank of England, and in 1873 to the City Temple, Holborn Viaduct. We have an honoured relative who has been a member of this church for nearly fifty years, now presided over by DR. JOSEPH PARKER.
