

Dalgety relieved. Boers retreat northward under Botha.

- Apr. 27—Junction of French with Ian Hamilton at Thaba N'Chu.
- Apr. 28—Boers attack a British convoy near Thaba N'Chu.
- Apr. 30—Lord Roberts report's repulse of the enemy by General Rundle near Thaba N'Chu.
- May 1—The Canadians and Gordons routed the Boers at Thaba N'Chu.
- May 2—General Hamilton drove the enemy out of their strong position at Houtnek.
- May 3—The British capture and occupy Brandfort, and the Boers flee to the northward.
- May 4—General Hutton and his brigade meet and defeat the Boer Irish-American Brigade and then press towards the Vet river.
- May 5—General Roberts reached Smaldeel on the Vet River. General Hamilton occupied Wynberg.
- May 7—The Transvaal Volksraad met and "determined to continue the War to the end."
- May 8—Boers continue to flee to the north. General Hutton and General Broadwood had brushes with the enemy at Zand River.
- May 9—Lord Roberts reached Welgelegen on the South side of the Zand River.
- May 10—Lord Roberts crosses the Zand river.
- May 11—The British advance continues.
- May 12—Lord Roberts entered Kroonstadt. General Buller drove enemy from their positions in the Biggarberg Mountains.
