Letter from Governor Carleton to His Excellency Governor Parr with a Memorial from the Homfe of Affemblyat New Brunfwick, confidered by the House.

Resolution thereon.

The Bill "Intitled An Act to explain and amend an Act, paffed in "the Twenty ThirdYear of His prefent Majesty's Reign," intitled, an Act for relieving bis Majesty's Subjects professing the Popish Religion from certain Penalties and Disabilities imposed upon them by two Acts of the General Assembly of this Province made in the Thirty Jecond Year of his late Majesty's Reign intitled, An Act confirming Tites to Lands and quieting Posses, and an Act for the Establishment of Religious Public Worship in the Province and for suppressing Popery.

And also the Bill intitled, an Alt in Amendment of an Alt passed in the Sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign intitled, an Alt concerning Schools and Schoolmasters, were read a third time, and

Ordered to be fent to the Council.

Mr. Uniacke who went with the above Bills to the Council reported he had delivered them.

A Bill intitled, an Act for continuing and amending an Act intitled, an Act to raife a Sum of Money towards keeping in Repair the Roads leading from Halifax to Windfor and the Diffrict of Colchester.

A Bill intitled, an Act to alter, amend and continue an Act passed in the 24th Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled, an Act for more effectually raising a Duty of Excise on Wine, Rum, and certain other enumerated Articles.

Alfo a Bill intitled, an Act for continuing and amending an Act intitled, an Act for more effectually raising a Revenue within this Province for the Support of its Government, were prefented and read a first Time, and ordered to be read a fecond time To-morrow.

Leave having been given to Major Milage, to bring in a Bill intitled, an Ast regulating the Trial of Causes of Astion where the Debt does not exceed the Value of three Pounds, the same was presented, and read a first Time, and

Ordered to be read a fecond time on Monday.

A Letter from His Excellency Governor Carleton, addreffed to His Excellency Governor Parr, (and by him recommended to the Confideration of the Houfe) with a Memorial from the Houfe of Alfembly at New Brunfwick to Governor Carleton, praying, that the Bonds and Securities which had been given to the Treasurer of Nova-Scotia, prior to the Division of this Province for the Payment of the Duties of Impost and Excise by Perfons refident in New Brunfwicksthould be affigned to the Treasurer of New Brunfwick, being taken into Confideration, it was thereupon,

Refolved, That a heavy Debt being left on the Province of Nova-Scotia, a confiderable Part of which had been incurred by Services rendered to that Part of the Province now called New Brunfwick, this Houfe cannot fee the Propriety of delivering over to the People of New Brunfwick the Bonds and Securities requefted, unlefs they will undertake to difcharge an equitable Proportion of fuch Debt.
