Bill for relieving His Majesty's Roman Catholic Subjects.

The Bill "Intituled An Act to explain and amend an Act, passed in " the Twenty Third Year of His present Majesty's Reign," intituled, an *Act for relieving his Majesty's Subjects professing the Popish Religion from certain Penalties and Disabilities imposed upon them by two Acts of the General Assembly of this Province made in the Third and Second Year of his late Majesty's Reign* intituled, *An Act confirming Titles to Lands and quieting Possessions*, and an *Act for the Establishment of Religious Public Worship in the Province and for suppressing Popery*.

Also Bill concerning Schools and Schoolmasters, read a third Time,

And also the Bill intituled, *an Act in Amendment of an Act passed in the Sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign* intituled, *an Act concerning Schools and Schoolmasters*, were read a third time, and

Ordered to be sent to the Council.

And sent to the Council.

Mr. Uniacke who went with the above Bills to the Council reported he had delivered them.

Bill for continuing the Act to raise Money for keeping in Repair the Roads from Halifax to Windsor, &c.

A Bill intituled, an Act for continuing and amending an Act intituled, *an Act to raise a Sum of Money towards keeping in Repair the Roads leading from Halifax to Windsor and the District of Colchester*.

Bill to alter and continue the Excise Laws.

A Bill intituled, an Act to alter, amend and continue an Act passed in the 24th Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, *an Act for more effectually raising a Duty of Excise on Wine, Rum, and certain other enumerated Articles*.

Also Bill for continuing an Act for more effectually raising a Revenue, &c. read a first time.

Also a Bill intituled, an Act for continuing and amending an Act intituled, *an Act for more effectually raising a Revenue within this Province for the Support of its Government*, were presented and read a first Time, and ordered to be read a second time To-morrow.

Bill for regulating the Trial of Causes, read a first time,

Leave having been given to Major Milage, to bring in a Bill intituled, *an Act regulating the Trial of Causes of Action where the Debt does not exceed the Value of three Pounds*, the same was presented, and read a first Time, and

Ordered to be read a second time on Monday.

Letter from Governor Carleton to His Excellency Governor Parr with a Memorial from the House of Assembly at New Brunswick, considered by the House.

A Letter from His Excellency Governor Carleton, addressed to His Excellency Governor Parr, (and by him recommended to the Consideration of the House) with a Memorial from the House of Assembly at New Brunswick to Governor Carleton, praying, that the Bonds and Securities which had been given to the Treasurer of Nova-Scotia, prior to the Division of this Province for the Payment of the Duties of Impost and Excise by Persons resident in New Brunswick should be assigned to the Treasurer of New Brunswick, being taken into Consideration, it was thereupon,

Resolution thereon.

Resolved, That a heavy Debt being left on the Province of Nova-Scotia, a considerable Part of which had been incurred by Services rendered to that Part of the Province now called New Brunswick, this House cannot see the Propriety of delivering over to the People of New Brunswick the Bonds and Securities requested, unless they will undertake to discharge an equitable Proportion of such Debt.
