Given at the B.C.I. Last Night By Captain Collins.

Before a small gathering at the Collegiate Institute last evening Capt. Collins, Canadian representative of the St. John's Ambulance Society, gave a very fine lecture under the auspices of the National Women's Council, dealing with the work of the society and what had been accomplished.

His lecture was profusely illustrated with lantern slides, and by this means was very successful in demonstrating first aid work.

The society, which was born as early as 1848, has the distinction of having as its Grand Prior His Majesty the King. The Duke of Connaught is also a prominent member. The emblem is the Maltese cross.

The aim of the society is to give instruction in first aid, and with this in view the speaker had visited the local factories, having in view the formation of brigades.

The splendid lecture was greatly enjoyed, those attending being well repaid. Mr. W. G. Raymond made an excellent chairman.
