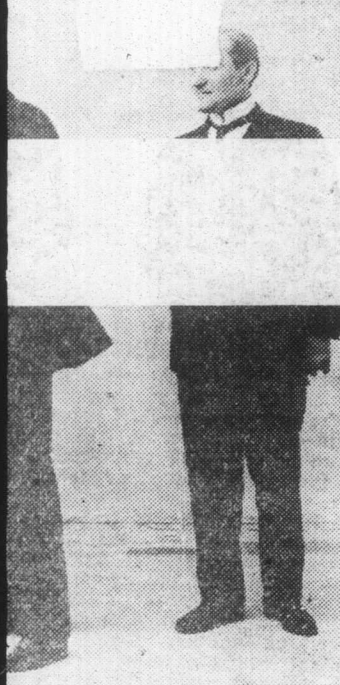

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE site head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

Duties—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within at least 80 acres, on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after ceasing homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

FREE FOUR WEEKS COURSE OF LECTURES ON AGRICULTURE

In St. George Fire Hall, Jan. 11th-February 8th, 1916.

Admission—No tuition fees. No entrance standard. No text books needed. No examinations.

Hours—The forenoon, from 9.30 to 12 o'clock, will be devoted to classroom work. In the afternoon it will be practical work in stock judging, etc.

This course of lectures is designed to benefit, more especially, those farmers' sons or young farmers who have been out of school for some time and feel the need of a better education, or wish to better understand the principles which underlie their business.

OUTLINE OF SUBJECTS.

Animal Husbandry—History and characteristics of the different breeds of live stock, breeding, feeding and the management of farm stock. Visits will be made to different stock farms where practical work in stock judging will be conducted.

Dairying—Feeding, care and management of dairy cows, production and handling of milk and cream, proper housing, ventilation, sanitation, practical work in cream and milk testing.

Feeds and Feeding—Study of the different feeds, composition, feeding rations, feeding standards, etc.

Poultry—Breeds, feeding, housing, killing, dressing, care and management of the flock.

Field Husbandry—Field crops adapted to this district. Selection of seed, varieties, rotation of crop, practical work in pruning, spraying and manufacturing of the different spraying materials. Culture of small fruits.

Soil—The important constituents of the soil, care and application of farm manure, fertilizers, their nature and use.

Botany—Identification and eradication of our most common weeds. Classification, means of dissemination, identification of weeds seeds in grain, grass, and clover seed. Plant structures and the relation of plants to soil, light, temperature and moisture.

Insects—Study of the common insects, life history, habits and means of control.

Fungus Diseases—A study of the common fungus diseases which occur on the farm, rusts, smuts, rots, blights, scabs and methods of control.

Bacteriology—A short study of the bacteria in soil, milk, silage and some bacterial diseases.
