HALIFAX LETTER

Halifax, Déc. 5—The chief item of interest in military matter during the past week has been the proclamation issued by His Excellency, the Governor-General, Canadians are not a war like paople and have not been trained in the game of war. It is not astonishing then that so many young men should take liberties which in civilian life would be attended by little or no serious consequences, but in military life are considered serious crimes. During the past summer some young men, without realizing the nature of the offence, left their military units and went to their homes or other places. In war times and at the front such conduct is punishable by death. Recognizing that so many well-intentioned but ill-advised young men haye taken liberties, the Governor General has issued an Order in Council granting royal clementy to such persons who before Decebmer 15th report to the Officer Commanding the Unit to which they belonged. Such a proclamation will be followed by the return of a number of young men who have realized the seriousness of their offence but have not known just how to return.


