On Monday, July 2nd, Canning will hold a celebration of Dominion Day by a full afternoon of horse races, sports, baseball match, etc. The dyke road to Millaton has been placed in perfect condition and horse races will be held there.

The vote on the second reading of the Conscription Bill in the House of Commons is expected towards the end of this week. Several amendments to the administration details of the Bill now contemplate by the Liberals may be accepted by the Government, as Premier Borden has invited suggestions to make the Bill more equitable and satisfactory. The third reading stage should be reached some time next week.
