

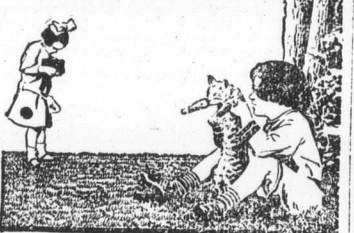

Miss Kate Ferguson, Yonge Mills, and Roy White, Caintown, were guests on Wednesday at Mrs. A. Eligh's.

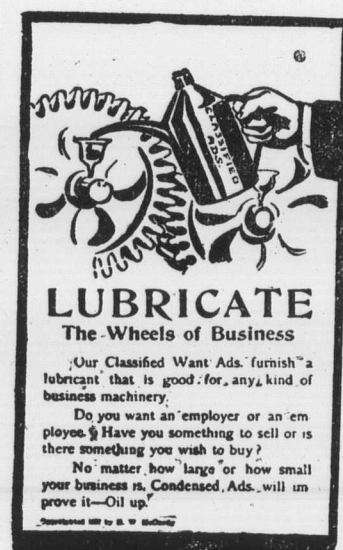
Many from here attended the Patriotic Rally at Mallorytown on Friday, Oct. 1st.

She was brought up in a Methodist home, and in early life joined the Methodist church and was a member at the time of her death. BIG GATHERING  
AT FRANKVILLE.

The Annual Agricultural Fair Held on Friday—Recruiting Meeting Held and Patriotic Speeches Delivered.

Frankville Fair on Friday attracted a large crowd of people and it is estimated there were over 2,000 people on the grounds. It proved to be better than last year and the directors and officers were pleased with the result of their labors. A pleasant day contributed to the pleasure of the visitors.

The exhibits in the hall were less than a few years ago. Ladies' fancy work and fine arts composed a considerable part of the inside exhibits, and it was very good. Some good home-made carpet was shown. Many good driving horses were in evidence in the ring.

Field sports, side attractions, the Toledo Band, and the trials of speed were the chief attractions.

In addition to the various attractions Lt.-Col. Wilkinson, of the 41st Regiment, Major A. M. Patterson and Lieut. Fairbairn, were present in uniform drumming up recruits. They had a goodly number of youths around them and they urged them to don khaki and go overseas like good Canadians. Several enlisted straightaway, and others are likely to follow suit.

Messrs. A. C. Hardy, Wm. C. MacLaren and John Webster also delivered rousing patriotic speeches from the bandstand, and forcibly presented the necessity for far more liberal enlistment among the young men of the district.

At night similar addresses were given by Mr. Hardy and Mr. Webster, assisted by Lt.-Col. Wilkinson and Major Patterson.

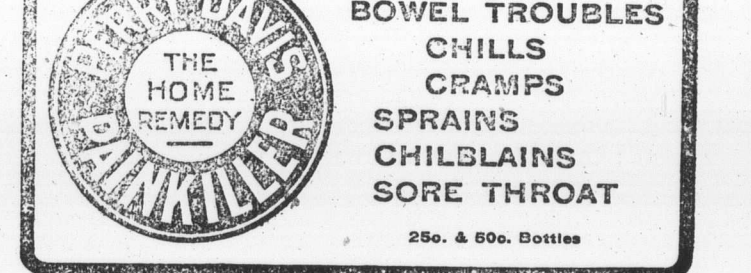
