While reading it, one doubtless thought of the poor little waif, child of the drunkard and profligate. They are chiefly "deserted." But the "neglected" cover a multitude of children in Christian homes. It is from this class many of the deserters come. It was this truth that presented itself most forcibly to the mind of the reader and we wondered if all the men engaged in moral reform were doing all in their power to train the moral and spiritual natures of the boys in their own homes.

We know boys who have grown from babyhood to manhood under the care of fathers, professedly Christian, who have never once shown the slightest interest in the salvation of their immortal souls, nor the training of their moral natures, leaving this entirely to the care of the mother, who not only cannot do her part, but that which she could do with his is made impossible to her by his neglect, and the boy suffers a loss eternally. These men are the regular church-goers and of an unimpeachable character. The boys go to church, too, and are in the way of receiving good.

While this state of things exists in the homes you may carry on your work of reform, but you will not be able to care for the "deserted" as fast as these so-called Christian homes will turn out "deserters."

When men take the position assigned to them by God and become "priests of their own households," bringing up their children in the fear of the Lord, training their young feet to walk in wisdom's ways, then will the "boy problem" be solved. "The home" is the church; the two divinely organized institutions will be sufficient to carry on the Lord's work. Reform the homes and there will be less need of "reform" farms.—Maritime Baptist.
