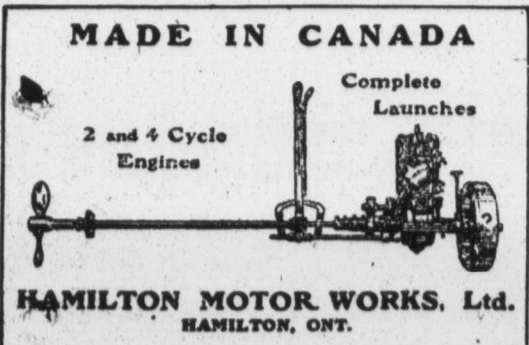

## GREAT INDUSTRIAL FUTURE FOR N. B.

Premier Robinson Believes That This Province is About to Share in Prosperity.

Moncton, Nov. 13.—Premier Robinson is of the opinion that New Brunswick is about to enter upon a period of great industrial activity. The premier expressed this opinion while referring to the recent sales of the Gloucester iron mines to the Drummond Mining Company. He said also that he believed that the company has in view the development of the water power provided by the falls of the Mepisguit River. This water power is said to be equal to ten thousand horse power. The Drummond people may also erect large iron smelting works at the mines.

As the premier pointed out the New Brunswick government is annually expending quite a large sum in testing the various mineral deposits of the province. This is money well spent, and the knowledge of the valuable deposits in Gloucester is largely due to the efforts of the Provincial Government.

CHINESE ANXIOUS TO COME.

Vancouver, B. C. Nov. 15.—W. L. McKenzie King yesterday made some inquiries of Yip Sing, Vancouver's wealthiest Chinaman, and was assured by Yip that if it were not for the prohibitive head tax half of China would emigrate to Canada. "If the tax were removed," said he, "I would import laborers myself, as Onderdonk did twenty-five years ago, when the tax was only \$35. With the tax at \$500 companies cannot afford to import."

Asked by the commissioner if the companies were bringing over Japs, on whom there was no tax, Yip Sing refused to answer. He, however, volunteered the information that he believed wages were too high in British Columbia. "Chinese laborers" he said "now want \$2.50 per day. A few years ago we could get them for half that. All over China they know of the good wages here and would come if they could afford it."

On the whole, the investigation went to show that it is only the head tax that keeps the Chinese out. If this were removed it is evident there would be a tremendous influx which would far exceed the immigration of Japs and Hindoos.

## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST.

Homestead Regulations.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:

(1). At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2). A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3). If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(4). The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5). A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.
