NEW LIGHTHOUSES

Port Daniel Harbor to Have
New One.

BADLY NEEDED.

Dept. Considering Placing of
Lights Between Campbell-
ton and Dalhousie.

(Special to Events)

Ottawa, Sept. 21.—Mariners and fishermen frequenting Port Daniel harbor, Bonaventure County, will be glad to learn that Mr. Marcell, M. P., has been successful in obtaining a lighthouse for the west point of that harbour, which was asked for by them. It is understood that the Lighthouse Board have agreed to grant this improvement with the exception of the harbour light on Port Daniel wharf, this will be the only light between Point Macquereau and Paspébiac, a distance of thirty miles. It was badly needed.

It is understood that the new light and Point Macquereau light recently burnt down will be erected without delay.

It is understood the Marine Department intend making some improvements in lighting up the channel between Dalhousie and Campbellton and that a report has been prepared to that effect and is now in the hands of the officials of that department.

TRAINS DROPPED

The Ocean Limited and
other trains Cancelled.

On Monday last a change in the I. C. R. time table came into effect. The principal change is the dropping of fourteen trains that appeared on the summer time-table.

The majority of these are for suburban or seaside business, but in the list are included the Ocean Limited and the train between St. John and Point du Chene known as the Boston express. The trains cancelled are Nos. 3, 4, 92, 99, 151, 154, 155, 156, 163, 164, 199, 200, 313 and 314.

No. 199 and 200 is the Ocean Limited working under a three year schedule, which has been in operation two years. Whatever the object of the conference, trainmen will be opposed to any change in the present schedule.

OFFICIALS CONFER.

Belief that Minister is Seek-
ing to Overcome Annual
Deficit.

Moncton, Sept. 15.—A large number of railway men are in the city today in conference with the minister of railways and his deputy. The object of the conference is to get the views of the officials and heads of different departments connected more directly with the operation of the road with a view of cutting down expenses. The movement is in line with a statement made by the minister at Moncton at the Labor day demonstration when he said every department would be called upon to wipe out late year's \$2,000,000 deficit.

How far the minister intends to go in his effort to reduce expense is a question causing serious speculation on the part of the railway employees. The conference today is mainly with the district superintendents and chief train despatchers to ascertain what improvement can be made in the matter of detention to trains, which it is alleged was a large item in the operating expenses last year.

In addition to the general manager, the chief engineer, general traffic manager and other chief officials in the operating department here, there were present at the conference the district superintendents from Truro, Campbellton, New Glasgow and chief train despatchers at Campbellton, Truro, New Glasgow and Sydney.

One source of complaint in respect to the expense of operating is the small freight trains running over the road.

Notice has been sent out to the order of railway conductors, locomotive engineers, firemen and others for a small committee from each of the orders to meet the minister and his deputy here tomorrow. The order was sent out by General Manager Pottinger but the exact object of the conference is unknown to the men.

The notice calling the committees to meet the minister has created quite a stir among the men and in some quarters it is thought an effort is to be made to reduce wages.

The trainmen are at present working under a three year schedule, which has been in operation two years. Whatever the object of the conference, trainmen will be opposed to any change in the present schedule.

OBITUARY.

ANGUS CARMICHAEL CAMPBELL
Angus Carmichael Campbell died at his home on Second Avenue, Ludington, La., Thursday night, Aug. 24th. He had been a sufferer from Bright's disease for over a year and was compelled to give up his work in the office of L. W. & V. S. Co. last June. He came South in Sept. 1903. The climate or conditions of the South had nothing to do with his disease as it is fatal in all climates. On account of the yellow fever quarantine the remains could not be taken north at present, so the remains were embalmed, placed in a metallic casket and taken to Leesville to be cared for until the quarantine is lifted, when they will be taken to Menominee, Mich., his old home, for burial.

Mr. Campbell was born in Quebec, Canada, Aug. 22, 1857. He had just passed his 48th birthday. He was loved and respected by all who knew him and was held in high esteem by the Company for whom he worked for twenty-two years. Mr. Campbell leaves a wife and two children to mourn the loss of a devoted husband and father. The sympathy of friends both in Ludington and Menominee goes to his sorrowing wife and family in this their great bereavement.

Ottawa, Sept. 21.—Mr. Marcell, M. P., for Bonaventure, and Deputy Speaker of the Commons, has returned to Ottawa, after spending a most agreeable vacation at Carleton, and in the County generally with Mrs. Marcell and his two daughters. All are delighted with their pleasant outing which they hope to make an annual event. Mr. Marcell is greatly pleased at his reception on all hands. In company with Mr. J. H. Kelly, M. L. A., he addressed meeting at Carleton, St. Jean le'Evangeliste, (Nouvelle) St. Omer, Maria, New Richmond, St. Charles de Caplin, St. Bonaventure, St. Alphonse de Caplin, New Carleton, Gaspes, St. Godefroi, Port Daniel, Gaspes and St. Alexis de Matapedia. Both members gave an account of their stewardship and indicated the progress which is being made. Bonaventure County is certainly making great strides and there are indications of prosperity and progress on all sides.
