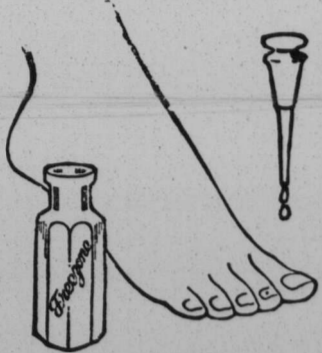

Weekly Agricultural Report

Grain harvesting is becoming quite general in many sections of the province. The crop varies greatly throughout the province. In sections of Carleton, where drought injured the crops to quite an extent, the crop is inclined to be light. Taking the province as a whole, the grain crop will be up to a fair average. It is somewhat thin on the ground but is well headed and well filled. Some northern counties report extra good crops of grain.

Reports of late blight on potatoes are beginning to come in from the potato inspectors. This has been much later than usual in showing up and the potatoes are nearer maturity. The cloudy weather, with little sunshine, seems to have favored the development of the disease. Just how far the blight will develop on the later varieties can not be estimated at present.

Cobblers are being put on the market now, the average price received by the growers being around \$3.00 per barrel.

Under Livestock Reports, there is little change from last week. The northern counties report farmers being offered \$5.00 each for lambs, but few sales being made. Lambs are in good condition generally and growing well. Pastures are getting shorter all the time. Recent rains will freshen them up somewhat. Cows are reported to be in good demand, with prices remaining high. Beef cattle are slightly lower in price, due to the larger number coming on the market.

Forger Works Moncton Business Men

Moncton, N. B. Sept. 3.—Using the name of the Geo. A. Fuller Co., contractors for the T. Eaton building in this city, a young man, whose identity is at present unknown, victimized at least three Moncton merchants last night to the extent of \$210 by a rather clever piece of forgery. Last evening an unknown man visited the stores of Mess. Fairweather, G. J. Spencer, druggist, and Nathan Schlegel's furnishing, purchasing goods in the three places to the amount of about seventy dollars, presenting in payment at each place a cheque for seventy dollars, purporting to be drawn by the Geo. A. Fuller Co. in favor of Harold C. McDonald. The young man presenting the cheques received the goods and about \$140 in cash in change. When the cheques were presented at the Bank of Montreal, this morning, they were declared to be forgeries. The forgeries have the Geo. A. Fuller stamp, and had the name of the paymaster, Geo. A. Foster, attached. The Fuller Co. declare no such man as Harold C. McDonald was in their employ. The police, with the meagre description given by the victims, have little hope of tracing the culprit.

McK-Ing Nominated for Prince P.E.I.

Summerside, P. E. I. Sept. 4.—At the Liberal convention here to-day Hon. W. L. MacKenzie King was unanimously nominated as candidate for the Prince by-election. His nomination was moved by Dr. John F. McNeill, Summerside, seconded by F. J. Boute, Tignish, and supported by A. E. McLean, Benjamin Gallant and A. C. Saunders, the three local representatives, who all waved their claims. Mr. King's name was the only one before the convention. Mr. J. H. Bell, the new provincial premier, accepted the nomination for Mr. King.
