As an instance of the increasing popularity of Canadian flour, it is intéresting to note that Dr. A. H. Stafford, born in Winnipeg but for some time past domiciled in Jamaica, recently said that until the steam ships "Canadian Forester" and "Can adian Government Merchant Marine Services came into Kingston last spring, every pound of flour used on the Island came from the United States. Now it all comes from Canada. This very valuable market for Canadian products has been captured by three ways, Dr. Stafford affirms; First, the fact that Canada had ships to deliver it there: Second, the quality of the flour itself; and Third, the fact that the people of Jamaica desire closer commercial and social relations with the people of Canada.


