### Blair Deceives Parliament.

\$4,000,000 Contract Without Tender

OTTAWA, April 13th.

This week the Government has shown decisive signs that it is weak and the party behind it divided. Laurier shows more and more what a weak man he is, while Borden, makes his strength manifest by the dignity and quiet force of his lead.

MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE A. POPINJAY.

On Tuesday Parliament resumed and the first thing we had was an exhibition of the incompetency of the Minister of Agriculture, and pretty well the last thing we had was a laughable demonstration of the absurdity of making such a man a Minister of Agriculture. On Tuesday, Sydney Fisher looking like a fatted two year old moved the third reading of his bill for the inspection of fruit packages. At the end of the week there was nothing left of the two year old steer but a small kidney and that was flizzing and contracting on a grid iron held by Monk, the leader from Quebec, and a most refined political cook, over a particularly hot fire to which his supporters added fuel while some blew the bellows. On Tuesday, he was almost stunned by a huckleberry lung at his oration by the persistent Taylor, Opposition whip, but on Thursday his ignorance as shown up by the aforementioned gentlemen was something portentous.

### FRANCHISE BUNGLING.

Every year emphasizes the huge blunder made when the local franchisees were adopted for Dominion elections. The Solicitor-General admitted on Thursday there were inevitable anomalies. The following illustration of the absurdity of having a local franchise for federal purposes could be paralleled from other provinces.

Last election Nov. 7, 1900. In New Brunswick, election took place on list prepared in fall of '99. Qualification of voter that he must have resided in the constituency 12 months prior to 1st of May, '99. Therefore, in a province where the qualification is 12 months' residence, in the actual working it meant more than two years.

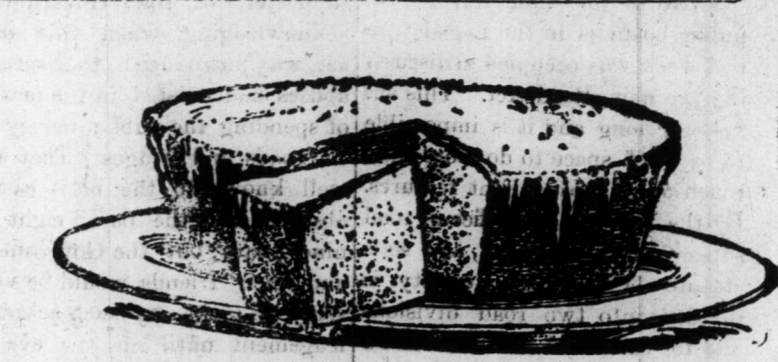

### The St. Peter's (London Docks) Church Defense League states that

at St. Peter's, Anglican Church there is an average attendance of children at the Holy Eucharist on Sundays of over 400, and that at St. Peter's, 3,057 confessions were heard during the twelve months ended December 31, 1900, of which number no fewer than 1,489 were made by men, and not one compulsory.

The Waldock-Rousseau Cabinet and their War Minister, General Andre, have been so much criticized and even roundly abused—not without reason, as my readers know—that they should be given credit for what they do sometimes in the interest of the clergy, says the Paris correspondent of the "London Monitor and New Era." It is a well-known fact that some years ago compulsory military service for clergymen was ordered, and the clergy had to "do" their French obligations in the army like other French citizens. General Andre has decided that, although he had not the power to exempt clergymen from this obligation—which could be done only by a law—he had the power of regulating its application so as to make it less irksome to those who come under it. Clergymen, together with medical and pharmaceutical students, will in future have to perform only one year's service and will not be incorporated into regiments, but placed on hospital duty. Moreover, as this position will leave them much time on hand, arrangements have been made for special lectures to be delivered to colonialists on illnesses and their treatment and on hygiene, so that those of them who go back as parish priests of country districts will be in a position to give their full valuable advice on corporal as well as on spiritual health. This measure of General Andre's is a broad minded one which should receive the recognition of all friends of the French clergy.
