> ASHINGTON, July 29—The right of Great Britain to canal was denied in the senate today by two advocates of the measure to give American coastwise shipping the preference in canal tolls. Senators Bradley, of Kentucky, and Massey, of Nevada, contended not only that the United States had the right under the treaty to regulate its own affairs, but that the purchase of the canal zone removed the entire subject from international control.


