

### **GENTURY OF VAST KRUPP WORKS TO BE CELEBRATED**

How Small Forge Grew to be the Greatest Works in Europe

Berlin, September 1 .- There are few fore fascinating stories in the histor; of industry than that furnished by the amous German firm of Krupp, relowned throughout the world, alike for s progress and achievement. The firm about to celebrate the centenary o xistence, and the Kaiser true to hi olicy of associating himself, with ev ery important phase of activity in h country, is to grace the celebration with his presence. So important as event must perforce arouse interes outside Germany, seeing how foremos place the famous company fills among the great industrial organizations

It was in 1810 that Friedrich Krup purchased a small forge in Essen where he devoted himself to the prob em of manufacturing cast steel, bu chough the article was put on market by him in 1815 it comman out little sale, and the firm was a ching but prosperous.

Widow Carried It On After his death in 1826 the works were carried on by his widow, and Alfred, the eldest son, found himself mpelled to leave school at the age of 14 in order that he might assume their direction. For thirty years no striking results were achieved, though by 1845 the firm had expanded so that 122 workmen were employed.

It was 1847, according to the Ency-

world-wide fame. The Essen works were everywhere spoken of, and its output watched with the closest interest. The manufacture of weldless steel will forward them to the Treasury De-

en its position and to secure for it the leading place it now occupies in the field of German industry. Alfr Krupp, under whom the first success were achieved, died in 1887, being su ceeded by his only son, Friedrich Alfred, who devoted himself to the financial side of the business rather than to its technical side. Under him larger expansion still took place. In 1896 he leased the "Germania" ship building yard at Kiel, the place passing into the complete ownership of the firm six years later.

Friedrich Krupp died in 1902, at which time the total number of men employed at Essen and its associated works was 40,000. The enermous in-crease in the German navy has since een conductive to a still further de velopment of activity on the part of the firm as manufacturers of the steel plates and guns required for the new ships, so that now the Krupp works

The second group is the Friedrich-Alfred Iron Works, in Rheinhausen; the third, the Annen Rheinhausen; the third, the Annen Steel Works; the fourth, the Gruson Machine Works, at Magdeburg-Buck-au; and the fifth, the Germania ship-yards at Kiel.

The coal consumption of the entire establishment is two and a half million tons a year. 
