London, Wednesday, May 2—4:10 a. m.—Four thousand British cavalry

watered their horses at Zand River

Monday, 25 miles beyond Smaldeel,

where Lord Roberts continues to date

his dispatches. The scouts, who have

been searching the country for miles

south of the river. The enemy are

laagered in unknown force on the north

bank. Thus the British advance guard

are within 45 miles of Kroonstad.

The Free Staters, in the expectation

that Kroonstad will soon speedily be-

come untenable, are, according to in-

formation from Lorenzo Marquez, pre-

paring to transfer their government to

Heilbron, a little more than 50 miles

northeast.

SMALDEEL.
