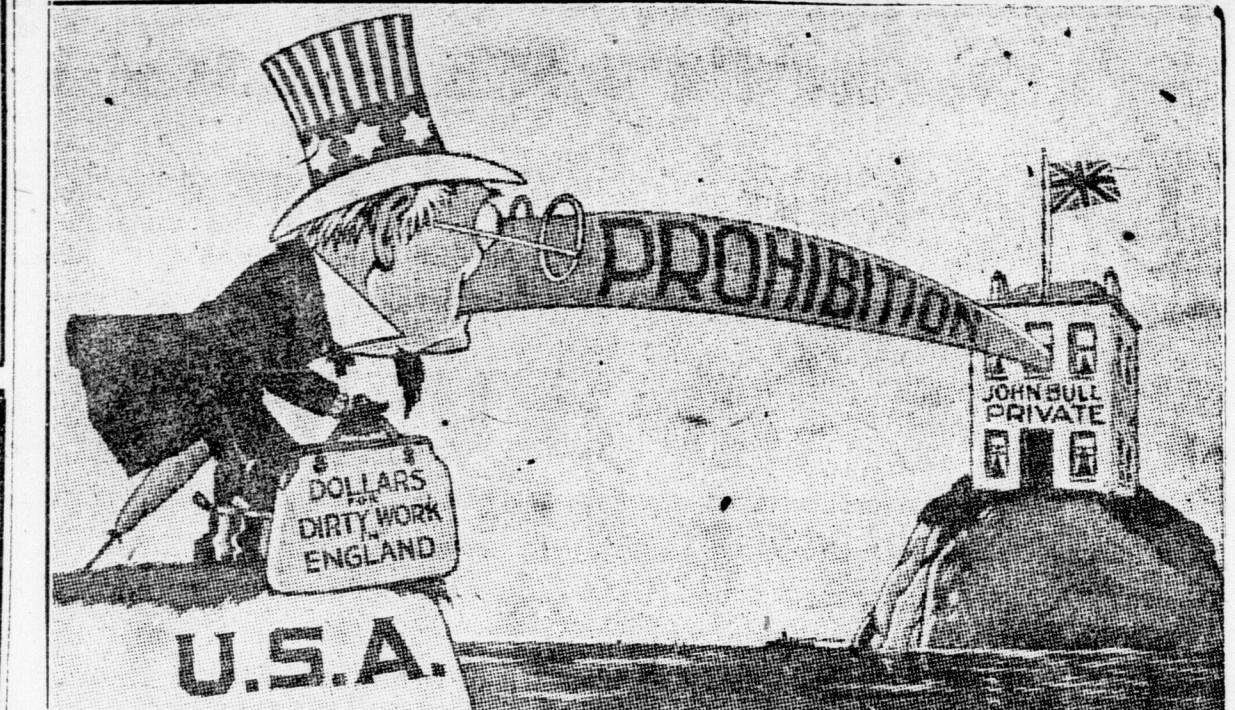

WOMAN BILLY SUNDAY TO APPEAR SHORTLY IN CITY OF WINNIPEG

Believes in Old-Fashioned Gospel and Preaches a Literal Hell.

An intensely interesting woman's figure will appear on the Canadian horizon in Winnipeg this month. It is Mrs. Alice Temple McPherson, often referred to as "The Woman Billy Sunday," who is regarded as one of the most successful and eloquent women preachers in America. She comes to Winnipeg to open a revival campaign there.

While only 28 years of age, she minces no words in her attacks on the vices and realities of the age. She preaches an old-fashioned gospel, and those behind the campaign predict that Winnipeg will experience a real heaven-on-earth revival.

Vast Crowds.
Vast crowds have turned out to hear her in the American cities, and in a recent campaign in New York she preached to 2,000 people afternoon and evening.

Mrs. McPherson believes in the old-fashioned religion, and takes every word of the Bible to be the word of God. She believes and preaches a literal hell, which can be averted only by the acceptance of Christ, and contends that it is a woman's privilege and duty to preach such a message. Her ministry, however, has been of a practical character, and frequently she has come down into the slums and preached and prayed to the pleasure-seekers. She took the "Barbaric Coast" in San Francisco.

PLAN SIMILAR TO THE I. O. D. E. MEMORIAL UNDER WAY IN U. S.

British University Women in United States To Arrange For Exchange of Professors, etc.

In view of the I.O.D.E. war memorial campaign, the return visit to this continent of Dr. Caroline Spurgeon is especially interesting, says the Toronto Telegram. This week Dr. Spurgeon is in Boston. It will be remembered that this distinguished British university woman visited Canada as a member of the British Educational Mission, in her eloquent speech to Toronto university women she pleaded for an interchange of scholarship between the two countries.

As the result of such a plan in the United States a delegation of American college women, including Miss Virginia Hildebrand of Harvard and Dean Helen Taft of Bryn Mawr visited Great Britain last summer.

Fellowship This Year.
Now Dr. Spurgeon has come over as the head of a delegation of three British university scholars who have accepted the invitation of the committee on international relations of the Association of Collegiate Alumnae to visit the United States further the plan of the formation of an international organization of university women. The plan includes an exchange of professors and lecturers between American and European colleges for women, the extension of women's studies generally, and the establishment of bureaus abroad for American college women and others here for those of European colleges.

Under the I. O. D. E. plan, for the first time college women, as well as men, will be eligible for scholarship awards. The plan was named the Memorial Rose Stedman Fellowship, in honor of Dr. Rose Stedman, member of the British Educational Mission, who died in New York City last spring on the eve of sailing for England.

Macaroons.—One cup brown sugar, half cup shortening, two eggs well beaten, half teaspoon vanilla, one teaspoon almonds, half teaspoon baking powder, 1 1/2 cups flour; mix well, then stir in four cups of macaroons. Bake in advance for your trouble and patience with us all. I will sign myself—

Carrot Marmalade.—Wash, scrape and grate two pounds of carrots; add the same amount of ripe pared peaches; measure the mixture, and to each pint allow one-half pint of sugar; put the carrots and peaches mixed in a kettle; stir constantly until it reaches the boiling point, then cook slowly for twenty minutes; now add your sugar and the juice of two lemons, and boil slowly until transparent. This is one of Mrs. Sarah Rorer's recipes. She used to be one of the editors of the Ladies Home Journal. It is splendid.

Spice Cake.—Three-quarters cup white sugar, half cup butter, two eggs, two tablespoons molasses, three-quarters cup buttermilk, one cup chopped raisins, one cup of raisins, one cup of cinnamon, one cup of flour, one-third cup white flour, one small teaspoon soda, half teaspoon salt, one-half teaspoon cinnamon, half teaspoon nutmeg.
Beat the sugar, butter, and eggs together until light. Add the molasses, then the raisins, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Sift the flour and soda together, and add to the mixture. Bake in a greased pan for 35 minutes.

Maple Syrup Tart.—One cup maple syrup, one cup water, one teaspoon of butter, one cup of sugar, one cup of starch, half teaspoon salt, beat yolks, mix cornstarch in a little water and butter in a deep cup; heat; cook in double boiler until thick; stir in whites of eggs for meringue; bake crust first. I find this fine.
LILY OF THE VALLEY.

Not Bread.—Two and a half cups of flour, half cup graham flour, quarter cup sugar, one teaspoon salt, four tablespoons baking powder, one cup water, one cup raisins, 1 1/2 cups milk, one egg. MRS. JIGGS.

Beef Loaf.—Three pounds beef, trim and ground, one teaspoon black pepper, one teaspoon salt, one egg, tablespoon butter, one cup milk, one cup rolled crackers; form into loaf, put on a saucer in a deep roasting pan, cover and bake two hours. Nice hot for dinner or cold for supper.

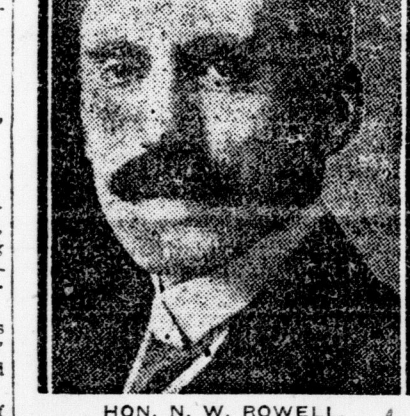
Coffee Cake.—One cup coffee, one cup molasses, three-quarters cup shortening, half cup sugar, one large teaspoonful salt, one egg, one cup flour, one cup sweet milk, one cup raisins, half cup salt one teaspoon soda; steam 2 1/2 hours. Serve with sauce.
ECONOMICAL ELLEN.

Potato Scopes.—Boil and mash three potatoes, add one teaspoon salt, one tablespoon butter, beat well; add two beaten eggs, half cup milk, flour to make a drop batter (one teaspoon of hot griddle in greased ring). This is the recipe that appears in cook book, but I prefer adding a little more flour in the oven.
HONEY B.

Crumble Pie Crust.—One cup flour, pinch of salt, 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, two tablespoons brown sugar, two tablespoons lard; crumble all together dry; put apples or mince in pan and pour crust on, sprinkle nutmeg half cup of water on top of crust. This is fine.
BUSY MOTHER.

Here is a recipe for cheese biscuits: Four cups of flour, one level teaspoon salt, one level teaspoon of baking powder, two tablespoons of shortening or dripping or lard, one cup grated cheese. Directions: Mix the whole to a soft dough, cut to shape; bake in very hot oven for five to seven minutes; watch the oven closely or the biscuits will burn.
NURSING SISTER.

Here is a nice recipe for oatmeal drop: Here they are very good. One and a half cups sugar, one cup cream or milk, one cup butter, one cup flour, one cup oatmeal, one cup raisins or nuts.

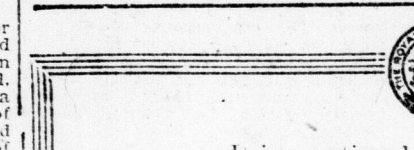
I am enclosing a good recipe for stuffed potatoes: Five medium-sized potatoes; bake in their skins, and when done cut off a small slice from one end, scoop out the inside and rub through a wire sieve; add to it half an ounce of butter, one tablespoonful of grated cheese, pepper and salt, and the yolk of one egg. Mix well, refill the skins, put on the slices which were cut off, and put in the oven again for ten minutes before serving.
ONLY ME.

Here is a recipe for a dark layer cake which is splendid: Two eggs, one cup brown sugar, half cup blackstrap, half cup butter, one teaspoon each of soda, cinnamon, nutmeg, half cup sour milk, 1 1/2 cups flour. Bake in layers, put raisins in for filling.
CINDERS.

Johnnie Cake.—One cup cornmeal, one cup wheat flour, half cup sugar, one beaten egg, two tablespoons shortening, a little salt, one teaspoonful of soda dissolved in one cup sour milk. Mix dry ingredients first, and bake twenty minutes in fairly hot oven. May be used for muffins if wished, and is quite good without the egg if a little more cornmeal and flour are added. Serves not with syrup, or split peas and toast.

Sugarless and Eggless Pudding.—One

cup suet, one cup raisins, 1 1/2 cups sour milk, three-quarters cup molasses, one teaspoonful each of cloves, cassia, 4-5 drops of vanilla, and serve with your favorite sauce. If a tablespoonful of lard is used instead of the suet the pudding will pass for cake if cut when cold.
