

Hill was a young man and unmarried.

KINGSTON, July 26 - The coroner's jury which is investigating the death of William Castell, who was killed by being struck with a bat at the Sydenham picnic on Wedesday, brought in a verdict of manslaughter against Robert Wycott, who is now in jail. Castell's skull, it was found, was no thicker than the blade of a knife.
