The Welsh Settlers

Repatented People From Patagonia Are Settled at Salt-coats, Alberta.

Dominion Customs Returns For June Show Half a Million Increase.

Ottawa, June 30.—The Welsh immigrants from Chabut, Patagonia, who arrived last week, have been located to gether on government land near Salt-coats, Alberta.

Customs returns for June show an increase of half a million dollars. The total increase for the year will be about \$3,500,000.
