VICTORIA WATER

Attention is called to Section 1000, which reads as follows: "The City Engineer or person shall sprinkle in any manner whatsoever, supplied by the City upon lawns, or grounds of any description, between the hours of 5 a.m. and 10 p.m., and the hours of 5 p.m. and 10 p.m., unless the water is supplied by meter."

The ordinary fine for each offence under this provision shall be not less than five dollars, nor more than ten dollars, unless the offence is repeated, in which case the fine shall be not less than ten dollars, nor more than twenty dollars, or a term of imprisonment, or without hard labor, not exceeding three months.
