RUSSIAN CONGRESS.

ROYAL ITALIAN OPERA COMPANY.

The scheme of the Royal Italian opera company of Covent Garden (limited), capital £300,000, embraces Covent Garden and Her Majesty's. Among the directors are the Earl of Lathom (chairman), Count Gleichen, Baron Ferdinand, Rothschild, and Mr. Ernest Gye.

BRADSHAW'S.

Bradshaw's does not intend to bring a motion to Westminster on the 3rd day of August, when he will present himself at the table of the house, claiming parliamentary privilege, but adds that he cannot prevent a crowd gathering. The police will exclude the public from the place yard that day.

At Philadelphia the iron trade has advanced one-half per cent per pound.

WASH. PACIFIC RAILROAD.

The Wash. Pacific railroad declared a dividend of 1 1/2 per cent as the preferred stock.

LIQUOR DEALERS.

Two hundred and sixty-five liquor dealers of Williamsburg, Pa., were arrested today for keeping open bars on Sunday.

CHRISTIAN PRIZE.

Christian Prize, a saloon keeper of Philadelphia, charged with complicity in the state route mail frauds, has been arrested in progress of construction. The new corporation will be known as the New York, Pittsburg and Chicago railway company. The capital is seven millions.

REMOVAL OF PENNY'S REMAINS.

London, July 20. - The Times says it is little better than a mockery to think of doing honor to such a man as Penn by the grotesque proposal to disinter his remains. The thing is happily impossible, as the trustees of the burial place state they are not certain of the exact spot where the remains were interred, but even if it were possible it would surely be distinctly forbidden by the instinctive, irresistible sentiment of the two great nations.
