Had the best of order prevailed it would have been difficult to avoid fathities; for the theatre was built of the flimatest material and the flames spread with incredible rapidity. When the fire was over a horror atricken crowd surrounded the building, while workmen and friends mangled remains. Seventy-five persons perished by fire or by being tram pled under foot, and 100 were injured.
