The Corner Stone of Centennial Methodis Church Laid. Yesterday afternoon was the occasion of the laying of the corner stone of the Cen-tonnial Methodist Church on Dovercourt Road. There were present many of the city ministers, including Dr. Potts, Dr. Johnson, Dr. Briggs, Rev. A. B. Chambers and

The chairman of the meeting, Rav. J. F. German, opened the proceedings by announcing the cause of their coming together.

Rev. Geo. H. Bishop followed with a short . W. F. Wilson. prayer; after which Dr. Johnson read a chapter from 1st Corinthians.

J. J. Ferguson, the pastor of Rev. J. J. Ferguson, the pastor of the church, in a few words stated the origin of the church and that its increased membership demanded enlarged accommodation. He said that for some time a building erected by the Baptists had been used, but now they were erecting for themselves. He informed his listeners that the word centennial was used in the naming of the church as the year 1891 celebrates the first century of Methodism in Canada.

1891 celebrates the first century of methodism in Canada.
Rev. A. B. Chambers congratulated the people on the favorable auspices, and took personal pleasure in being present. He reminded his audience that 144 years ago the first Methodist conference was held in England, and 99 years ago the first Methodist Church in Canada was erected at Hay Bay. To-day there are in the Dominion between 8000 and 4000 Methodist churches, and property to the value of \$10,000,000. In America there was an average of ten Methodist Churches being erected every day. The success was due, he thought, to the consecrated and intelligent zeal of Methodist ministers.

Rev. Dr. Briggs rejoiced that friends from other denominations were present. He was not in favor of the union of all Protestant churches, but believed that the difference of opinion and friendly emulation were good, as long as motives were understood. There was always a fear that the energy which should be devoted in Christian work might be spent in ornamentation. The speaker concluded by saying that the Methodists were philanthropists.

The chairman claimed that the next speaker, Dr. Potts, was selected with the view of preceding the collection as he was especially adapted for reminding the people of their duty in this regard. After the collection Rev. J. F. German presented the trowel to J. P. Bull, who declared the "stone well and truly laid." Mr. George A. Cox laid the stone on the south corner and concluded with a few remarks. Rev. C. J. Dobson lead in prayer and the benediction was pronounced by Rev. J. J. Readitt. The tin box in the stone contained the last issue of all the city papers and the Methodist journals and reviews.
