Gillies & facEchen of Sydney, Cape Briton, that they will apply to Parliament for an act to ncorporate a company under the name of the Boynton Bicycle Electric Railway Company of Canada, to construct, equip and operate a bicycle electric railway from the city of Winnipeg, Manitoba. to the port of Louisbourg, in the County of Cape Breton, Nova Scotia, and between any places within the said points, with power to acquire, take and use water power to acquire, take and use water powers, and to make contracts for the supply of electrical power for the operation of said railway; also to construct and operate all works and appliances necessary for the purposes of the company, and for authority to do all other acts incidental to or necessary for the construction and opera-


