FINANCE AND TRADE. A good deal of wheat has been taken to make a profit at present. It is estimated that there is not over a million bushels of Ontario wheat in the province.

"There is very little Ontario wheat being carried now by dealers, as the remainder in the trade yesterday. 'We had so little at this season of the year, said, 'and do not owe the banks anything. The cheapest market just now are the Ontario and Detroit. Ontario prices 7c to 8c too high to do an export business.

"At the monthly meeting of our agent New York on Thursday no change was made in prices. Production for May placed at 2,800,000 tons, against 3,000 tons in May of last year.

The last shipment of Valencia raisins London, according to advices from Denon, April 4, was 6000 tons. The price of raisins has fluctuated during the season from 12 1/2 to 14, closing at the last report on 12 1/2. The shipment amounted to 401,070 quintals, 179,930 quintals less than last year.
