A date was set for a special meeting to captude the matter, and this was ing, to conclude the matter, and this was duly held on Monday afternoon and Tues-day morning. The first session was devot-ed to giving the by law two readings and to a discussion of some allegel trifling irregularities in the by law which the solicit-

or stated did not affect its validity.

The surprise came when the vote was taken upon the adoption of the first clause, which authorized the Council to raise the which authorized the Council to raise the money, and was virtually the enacting clause of the by law. The motion was deteated by a vote of 7 to 5. Those who voted for the by law were Messrs, Coyle, Kittermaster, McMahon, Bailey and Warden McIntyre The council was in committee of the whole with Mr. Proctor in the chair. Mr. Proctor tuned to the members who had voted in the newsitive and made a few had voted in the negative and made a few remarks which showed his resentment at their action. He characterized as very strange indeed their action in voting to have a by-law published, with all its expense, and then turning round and voting the same bv-law out of existence.
