six to sixteen stories above ground, with two or three floors under the earth, for using these buildings during all of the twenty four hours of every day for business and out their edifice with a frontage of one hundred and fifty feet and occupying a single floor, with their church proper and Sunday school room placed side by side. And this space, which they enclose and shut in from the cheerful habitations of men, they use about ten hours a The rest of the time it is occupied by mice, silence and gloom. It is no wonder that they try to shirk the burden of taxation. A business conducted with such extravagance would be strung up on the reef of bankruptcy within six months. The question arises, Could not a part of this valuable ground be so improved as to secure to the church a permanent endowment for its missionary, philanthropic and educational needs?"
