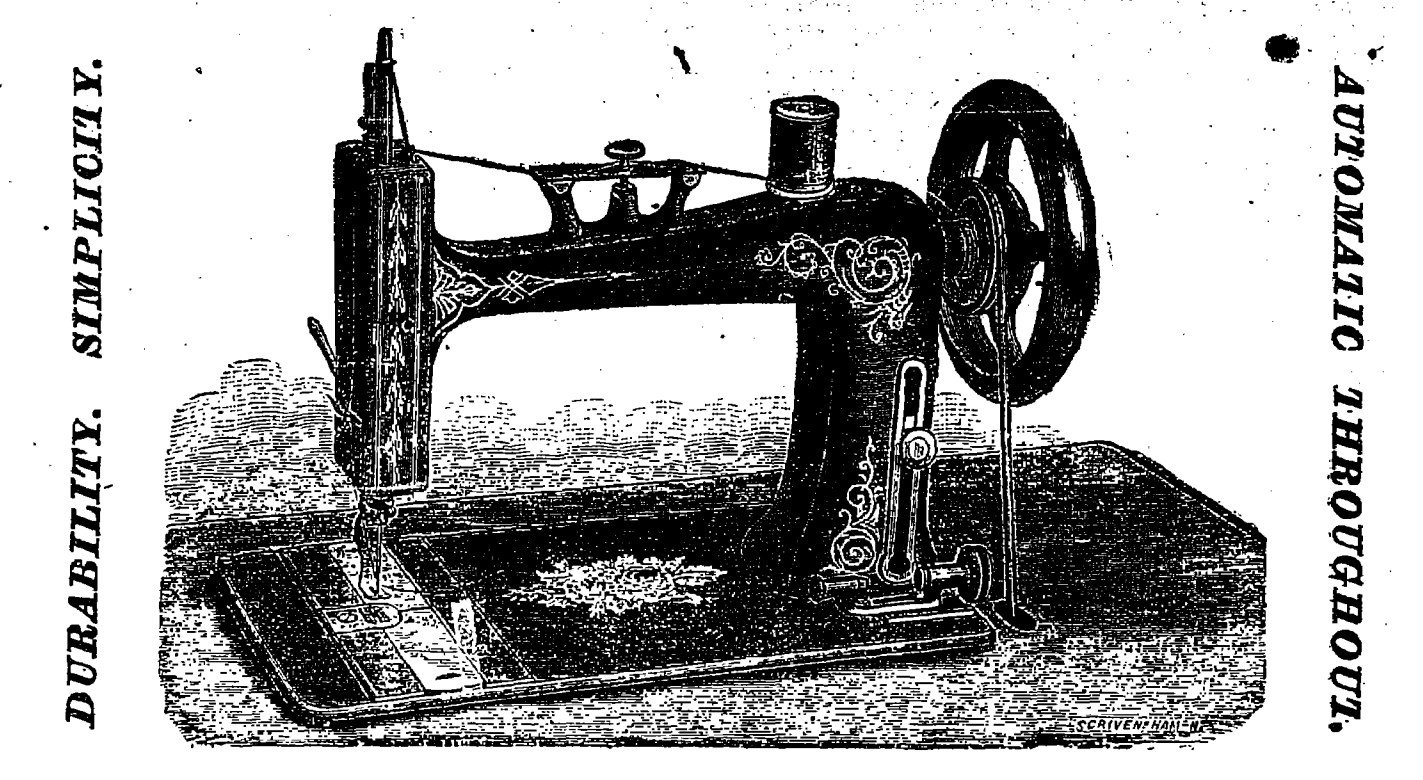
MONTREAL HORSE MARKET. Business has been very dull. A few dealers from the West were in town with horses, but heeds to sell them below cost.
