EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF CANADA AND THE U.S.S.R. EXTENDING THE AGREEMENT ON PROVISIONAL RULES OF NAVI-GATION AND FISHERIES SAFETY IN THE NORTHEASTERN PACIFIC OCEAN OFF THE COAST OF CANADA SIGNED JANUARY 22, 1971

EXCELLENCY,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics on Provisional Rules of Navigation and Fisheries Safety in the Northeastern Pacific Ocean off the Coast of Canada, done at Moscow on January 22, 1971.⁽¹⁾ In accordance with the arrangements recorded in the Summary Records of the meetings of representatives of our two Governments held in Ottawa, November 21-25, 1974 and in Moscow, January 23 and 24, 1975, I have the honour to propose, on behalf of the Government of Canada, that the Agreement be extended for a period of one year from April 15, 1975.

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, I have the honour to propose that his Note, in English and in French, and Your Excellency's reply in Russian to that effect, shall constitute an agreement between our two Governments, to extend the Agreement of January 22, 1971 on Provisional Rules of Navigation and Fisheries Safety on the Northeastern Pacific Ocean off the Coast of Canada, for a period of one year, and to propose that such agreement enter into force on April 15, 1975.

Accept, Excellency, the assurances of my highest consideration.
