## CANADA JOINS INTERNATIONAL SANCTIONS ON YUGOSLAVIA

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Barbara McDougall, today announced that Canada is taking action to impose a further set of sanctions against Yugoslavia following the United Nations Security Council resolution 757 adopted on May 30, 1992.

In line with the UN decision, Canada will impose a full import and export embargo on all goods originating in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) or shipped there. The UN sanctions exclude medical supplies and foodstuffs.

The Canadian government will take immediate steps to identify any relevant funds or other financial or economic resources in Canada and deny access to them to the authorities of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro). The government is also taking action to implement the UN sanctions in the fields of science, technology, culture and sports.

Mrs. McDougall recalled that Canada had already taken other measures against Yugoslavia, including the closing of two Yugoslav consulates in Canada on May 24, and the suspension of the licences of Yugoslav Airlines (JAT) and of any further authorizations to any Yugoslav air carrier for air services between the two countries.
